


## Afternoon Book Chat at the Senior Center


Meetings are held in the Multipurpose Room

***The Banker's Wife*** by Cristina Alger



***Chocolate Covered Murder*** by Leslie Meier



***Lincoln in the Bardo*** by George Saunders


Set over the course of a night, 16th President mourns and reflects after the death of his 11-year-old son at the dawn of the Civil War.
